(Note: This form is a model form of the NYS Office of Real Property Services. It should be noted that under the provisions of the RPTL Section 528, assessor(s) or his/her designee, are required to be in attendance with the roll for at least four hours on at least 4 days (unless the number of days is increased to more than 4 by local law. On at least one of these 4 days, the hours of attendance by the assessor, or his/her designee, must include not less than two hours after 6:00PM. Also, at least 2 such days shall be at least 10 days subsequent to the filing of the tentative assessment roll, of which one day shall be a Saturday. It should also be noted that the Board of Assessment Review must meet for no less than four hours, and not less than two hours must be scheduled after 6:00PM.)
